These Course and Examination Regulations (henceforth OER) have been drawn up in accordance with the Higher Education and Research Act [ Wetop het hoger onderwijs en wetenschappelijk onderzoek; WHW] (henceforth the Act) and the following Leiden University regulations:

- the Leiden Register of Study Programmes Framework Document;
- the Academic Calendar;
- the Regulations for Student Registration, Tuition Fees and Examination Fees;
- the Regulations for Admission to Master's Programmes.

Pursuant to Article 7.14 of the Act, the Faculty Board regularly evaluates the Course and Examination Regulations and considers, for the purpose of monitoring and adjusting the study load, how much time it takes students to comply. In accordance with Article 9.18 of the Act, the departmental committee is assigned the ta sk of annually assessing the implementation ofthe OER.
These Course and Examination Regulations consist of two sections:

- a faculty section that is the same for all programmes and
- a section that contains information that is specific to a particular progr amme, what isknown as the programme-specific section of the Course and Examination Regulations.

## Chapter 2 Description of the Programme

## Article 2.1 Objectives of the programme

The programme has the following objectives:

1. to enable students to acquire academic knowledge, understanding and skills, and train them in the use of scientific methods in the field of English, French, German and/or Italian Literary and Cultural Studies;
2. to enable students to develop the following academic and professional skills:

- independent academic reasoning and conduct,
- the ability to analyse complex problems,
- the ability to clearly report academic results, both in writing and orally;

3. to prepare students for an academic career and;
4. to prepare students for a career outside academia.

- French Literature and Culture
- German Literature and Culture
- Italian Literature and Culture
- Literature in Society. Europe and Beyond

## Article 2.5 Study load

The programme has a study load of 60 credits.

## Article 2.8 Language of instruction

2.8.1. In compliance with the Code of Conduct regarding Language of Instruction [Gedragscode voertaal ${ }^{1}$ ] the languages of instruction and examination of the programme are English and, depending on the specialisation,

[^0]French, German or Italian. Students are expected to have an adequate command of the languages of instruction of the programme.
2.8.2. Contrary to Article 2.8.1, in individual cases the Board of Examiners can permit the student to write the final thesis in another language, in accordance with the Guideline on Language Policy. ${ }^{1}$

## Article 5.2 Admission to the programme

5.2.1 Pursuant to Article 7.30b (1) of the Act holders of (one of) the following degrees may be admitted to the indicated specialisation(s) of the programme, or who have successfully completed the following prescribed pre-master's/bridging programme:
a. A bachelor's degree from a Dutch research university (in the specialisation):

c. A prescribed pre-master's/bridging programme pursuant to article 5.4.1. The prescribed premasters/bridging programme must be completed within the nominal duration plus one semester (in case of a pre-master's/bridging programme of 30 EC or less) or plus one study year (in case of a pre-master's/bridging programme of more than 30 EC ).
5.2.2 The Faculty Board may, on request, grant admission to (one or more of the specialisations of) the programme to applicants who do not meet the requirements as specified in 5.2 .1 , points a and $b$, but who can demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Faculty Board that they possess a level of knowledge, understanding and skills equal to that of holders of a degree specified in 5.2.1, points a and b, possibly under further conditions.

To be considered as holding a degree equal to the one specified in 5.2 .1 a , applicants must meet the following requirements:

- a bachelor's degree from a research university, equivalent to the level of a Dutch academic Bachelor's degree, or demonstrate to meet the requirements for such a degree, including the General Academic Skills listed in Appendix B, and

In addition, applicants must also meet the following specific requirements per specialisation:

## Specialisation English Literature and Culture

- Knowledge of and insight in English Literature and Culture, comparable with the qualities acquired on completing the Bachelor's programme referred to in article 5.2.1, including:
- knowledge of and insight in the connections with North American literature and culture;
- knowledge of and insight in its development over the different periods (Middle Ages, Early Modern, and Modern);
- analytical skills needed for specifically literary analysis;
- a well-developed awareness of the relevant scholarly skills


## Specialisation French Literature and Culture

- Knowledge of and insight in French Literature and Culture, comparable with the qualities acquired on completing the Bachelor's programme referred to in article 5.2.1, including:
- knowledge of and insight in the connections with French speaking regions elsewhere in the world (so-called Francophonie);
- knowledge of and insight in its development over the different periods (Middle Ages, Early Modern, and Modern);
- analytical skills needed for specifically literary analysis;
- a well-developed awareness of the relevant scholarly skills.


## Specialisation German Literature and Culture

- Knowledge of and insight in German Literature and Culture, comparable with the qualities acquired on completing the Bachelor's programme referred to in article 5.2.1, including:
- knowledge of and insight in its development over the different periods (Middle Ages, Early Modern, and Modern);
- knowledge of and insight in cultural differences between the Netherlands and German speaking regions and elementary Dutch-German intercultural skills;
- analytical skills needed for specifically literary analysis;
- a well-developed awareness of the relevant scholarly skills.


## Specialisation Italian Literature and Culture

- Knowledge of and insight in Italian Literature and Culture, comparable with the qualities acquired on completing the Bachelor's programme referred to in article 5.2.1, including:
- knowledge of and insight in its position in the European literary-historical context;
- knowledge of and insight in its development over the different periods (Middle Ages, Early Modern, and Modern);
- analytical skills needed for specifically literary analysis;
- a well-developed awareness of the relevant scholarly skills.


## Specialisation Literature in Society. Europe and Beyond

- Knowledge of and insight in Literature and Culture, comparable with the qualities acquired on completing one of the Bachelor's programmes referred to in article 5.2.1, including:
- basic knowledge and understanding ofthe history of literature and of major literary works.
- knowledge of basic tools of literary analysis and proven ability to apply them.
- analytical skills needed for specifically literary analysis
- a well-developed awareness of the relevant scholarly skills.

Applicants with a bachelor's degree in International Studies are considered to have fulfilled all entry requirements for the specialisation Literature in Society. Europe and Beyond, provided that the student has chosen French, Spanish, German, Dutch or Port uguese and has done at least 30 EC in literary studies.

Applicants with a bachelor's degree in American Studies, European Studies, Arts and Culture Studies or Liberal Arts and Sciences with a focus on the Humanities are considered to have fulfilled all entry requirements for the specialisation Literature in Society. Europe and Beyond, provided that the student has done at least 30 EC in literary studies.

Applicants as referred to in Article 5.2.1b and Article 5.2.2. are requested to provide the Board of Admissions with information demonstrating that the applicant possesses the same level of knowledge, understanding and skills as holders of a degree as specified in Article 5.2.1a.

### 5.2.3 Language requirements

5.2.3.1 As further clarification of Article 2.8 concerning command of the language of instruction, a student who wishes to be admitted to an English-taught master's programme must have one of the following diplomas, or must meet the criteria of:

- an International Baccalaureate diploma (or other with English A);
- a diploma of secondary or higher education completed in the United States of America, the United Kingdom, Ireland, New Zealand, Australia or Canada (with the exception of French-taught education in Canada);
- a diploma of an English-taught university degree programme completed at a Dutch research university;
- a pre-university education(VWO) diploma.
- a high school (or higher) diploma obtained in an EEA country, where English has been studied up to and including the final year of the programme, and where the level of English can be considered comparable to Dutch VWO (pre-university education), to be determined by SEA (Admissions Office).
5.2.3.2 If a student who wishes to be admitted does not meet the requirements in 5.2.3.1, at least one of the following English language requirements for the specialisations for this master's programme can be set.

The following language requirements per specialisation apply:

## Specialisation English Literature and Culture:

- English IELT S7.5/TOEFL (Internet based) 113/C2 Proficiency (former CPE) or C1 Advanced (former CAE) 185;
- a minimum score of IELTS 7.0 or TOEFL 25 is required for each of the four components.

The requirement to provide an English language test result applies to all students who have completed a Bachelor's programme other than the Bachelor's programme referred to in article 5.2.1 a and b . This is at the discretion of the Board of Admissions.

## Specialisation French Literature and Culture

- English IELTS 7.0, TOEFL 100 (internet-based) or C2 Proficiency (former CPE); and
- French at level CEFR C1, as evidenced by an appropriate test (DALF C1 with a C1 score for each of the subtests).


## Specialisation German Literature and Culture

- English IELTS 7.0, TOEFL 100 (internet-based) or C2 Proficiency (former CPE); and
- German at level CEFR C1, as evidenced by an appropriatetest (Goethe-ZertifikatC1)


## Specialisation Italian Literature and Culture

- English IELTS 7.0, TOEFL 100 (internet-based) or C2 Proficiency (former CPE); and
- Italian: CEFRC1 (listening, reading) and CEFR B2 (speaking, writing), as evidenced by an appropriate test.


## Specialisation Literature in Society. Europe and Beyond.

- English IELTS 7.0/TOEFL (Internet based) 100/ C2 Proficiency (former CPE) or C1 Advanced (former CAE) 185;
- for the 'speaking' and 'writing' components, a minimum score of IELTS 7.0 or TOEFL 25 is required;

## Article 5.4 Pre-master's Programmes

5.4.1 The programmehas developed pre-master's programmes (for the following target groups) in order to remove deficiencies. Pre-master's programmes/bridging programmes must be completed successfully within the prescribed period as specified in sub Article 5.2.1c.
a. The pre-master programmes in the specialisations English, French, German and Italian literature and culture are intended for:

- students with a relevant bachelor's degree from a research university abroad, equivalent to the level of a Dutch academic Bachelor's degree, who do not fulfill the admission requirements specified in article 5.2.2,
- students with a Bachelor's degree from a university of applied sciences in English, French or German, equivalent to the level of a Dutch HBO bachelor's degree (lower secondary education certifica te, tweedegraads).
b. The pre-master programme in the specialisation Literature in Society is intended for students with a BA in Humanities or Social Sciences from a Dutch or foreign research university, who do not fulfil the admission requirements specified in article 5.2.2.

In addition to the pre-master programmes below, the Faculty Board may specify individual bridging programmes for other students who do not fully meet the entry requirements.

Students will not be admitted to the Master's programme if they have not completed the relevant premaster programme in its entirety.

The pre-master programmehas a study load of 60 EC and consists of first-year courses ( 30 EC ), second-year courses ( 5 EC ), third-year courses ( 10 EC ), an Academic Skills course ( 5 EC ), and the writing of a BA thesis ( 10 EC ). Students who successfully complete this pre-master programme will be admitted to the English Literature and Culture specialisation. The programme is as follows:

## Specialisation Italian Literature and Culture

The pre-master programmehas a study load of either 60 or 30 EC and consists of courses from the BA Italian Language and Culture. The 30 EC programme is intended for students with a BA in Humanities from a research university, who do not fulfill the requirements in 5.2.2.
The 60 EC programme is intended for students with a BA in Italian from a university of applied sciences, equivalent to the level of the Dutch HBO bachelor's degree, who do not fulfill the requirements in 5.2.2.

Students who successfully complete the pre-master programme will be admitted to the Italian Literature and Culture specialisation. The 60 and 30 EC programmes are as follows:
