Chapter 4 OER Bachelor Liberal Arts and Sciences: Global Challenges 2021-2022 addendum resit of a passed examination

Article 4.1 Frequency of examinations

4.1.8 If a student has passed an examination linked to a given component but nevertheless resits this examination without the permission of the Board of Examiners after the academic year in which the student passed this examination, the result of the last sitting will not be assessed

EXPLANATION

Participation in examinations that have already been successfully passed in academic year 2021-2022

The entry into force of Article 4.1.8 included in the template Course and Examination Regulations (henceforth OER) 2021-2022, which regulates the resit of a passed examination, has been postponed by one year. The reason for this is the reported implementation problems due to the complex manner of design and interpretation of the components within the various programmes.

In autumn, another implementation test will be carried out within the Harmonization Programme, in which the technical bottlenecks already put forward will be taken into account. Two basic principles leading in this regard are: (1) the possibility of one resit of a successfully passed examination during the bachelor's or master's programme; and (2) the highest result obtained in this resit counts.

As a result, Article 4.1.8 in the model OER 2021-2022 will only come into effect in the academic year 2022-2023. This means that an adjustment to the already established OER 2021-2022 is necessary. Article 4.1.8 will be replaced by the text that applied in the 2020-2021 academic year. Permission from the Board of Examiners is required for participation in examinations that have already been passed in academic year 2021-2022.
