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The outcome of the reaccreditation for all standards was excellent (except for one). No recommendations ensued from the NVAO Visitation Committee reports, for that reason there was no plan of action written for the standards. However, the Faculties themselves are working on improvement in the area of Intercultural Diversity and Integration.

Project 1: Intercultural Diversity and Integration – staff and students to further develop their intercultural competencies and the programmes to have a balanced, diverse student and staff body.

Upon recommendations from the NVAO Visitation Commission the following:

The Law Faculty and The Faculty of Governance and Global Affairs embrace the suggestion of the panel to include diversity in professional training such as the BKO for example. Programmes will actively seek training and courses to enhance the international classroom and diversity courses offered by the University and include these in their professional development strategy.

- Recruitment policies for staff will incorporate diversity (gender, cultural, background) as a guiding principle.
- Marketing materials will refer to diversity and inclusivity. Diversity will be actively promoted within the Faculties.
- Physical environment will include gender neutral and religious facilities.
- Consultation will take place with the Diversity Officer on creating awareness, tips and best practices.
- Organise events strengthening training of students to cooperate and realise that teamwork is a necessary skill to pursue their careers successfully.
